Next time you read through the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) try to observe how many times Jesus asks a question. By some estimates, he asks questions more than 300 times, and those are just questions that are recorded! It reminds me of those times when my own children were very young and would ask endless questions. It's how they learned. It's how Jesus taught.

I think sometimes we get so comfortable with our faith habits that we forget to ask ourselves questions. Here are just *some* of the "Jesus Questions" that I find most thought provoking. They are in Biblical order so you can easily look them up in context if you like.

- What do you want me to do for you? (Matthew 20:32)

- Don't you see that nothing that enters a man from the outside can make him "unclean?" (Mark 7:18)
- Do you still not see or understand? (Mark 8:17)
- Are your hearts hardened? (Mark 8:17)
- Do you have eyes but fail to see and ears but fail to hear? (Mark 8:18)
- When I broke the five loaves for the five thousand, how many basketfuls of pieces did you pick up? (Mark 8:19)
- When I broke the seven loaves for the four thousand, how many basketfuls of pieces did you pick up? (Mark 8:20)
- What do you want me to do for you? (Mark 10:51)
- Are you asleep? (Mark 14:37)

New Partnership

Our FLC Food Pantry is now a partner agency with community organization "Hope Initiative" located at the former rescue mission building.

"Our 5,000 sq ft Hope Distribution Center in Galesburg is stocked with products each month from Convoy of Hope, a world-wide nonprofit organization. This product (including food, cleaning supplies, shoes, backpacks, diapers, toys, and more) is available to your church FOR FREE !!"

How it works: Each month we will email a product inventory list to our partners. If there are items on the list that you can use for your organization, we will set up an appointment time for pick up. You can then use the product to meet the needs you see in your community."

⇒ Third Thursday on Third Street - Community Distribution Day

Each month Hope Initiative holds a Community Distribution Day. Individuals will be able to pick up a FREE box or bag of items on the 3rd Thursday of each month, at our warehouse on 3rd Street! First come first serve.

There are no qualifications, no questions asked, and no hidden agenda. We are distributing HOPE to our community!


